<b>9am to 10am</b> (60 min)  20 min (P) 40 min (Q & A)	<b>Workshop</b>	<b>School Variable Speed Zone and Signage Proposal</b> – Joanne McBride and Peter Daly  <b>Purpose:</b> In September 2024, the Government passed the Setting of Speed Limits Rule 2024, which requires Road Controlling Authorities (RCAs) to implement Variable Speed Limits outside every school in their area by June 30, 2026. NZTA has provided guidelines as to how the Rule must be implemented.  Since then, staff have consulted with each of the 27 schools in the Waimakariri District to determine their specific needs and have prepared a plan for each individual school outlining the extent of the Variable Speed Zones arising from the Government legislation and guidelines.  This workshop's intention is to appraise the Council of the rule's requirements as they relate to schools and how staff propose to apply the Rule to the 27 schools in the Waimakariri District.	Nil.
