MINUTE OF COMMITTEE

- [1] The Committee has received an application for a new off-licence from Te

 Tino Enterprises Ltd. The application was received by the Secretariat on the

 2nd July 2020, some 20 weeks ago. It was publicly notified.
- [2] The application attracted eighteen public objections. Accordingly, unless all the objectors do not require a public hearing, which the Committee does not consider likely, the Committee is obliged to call a public hearing to consider the application in accordance with s.202(3) of the Act.
- [3] Unfortunately for the applicant, the application has been caught up in the COVID-19 legislative environment. Pursuant to s.15 *Epidemic Preparedness Act 2006* the *Epidemic Preparedness (Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 Licence Application Inquiries) Immediate Modification Order 2020* came into effect on 17 April 2020. From that date subsections (3) and (4) of s.103 of the Act were modified and replaced by the following:
 - "(3) The Police and the Medical Officer of Health-
 - (a) must each inquire into the application; and
 - (b) if either has any matters in opposition to it, must file with the licensing committee a report on it within 30 working days after the end date.
 - (4) The licensing committee may decide an application for a licence only if it has received-
 - (a) a report from the Police; and
 - (b) a report from the Medical Officer of Health."

The end date referred to is fixed by Epidemic Preparedness (COVID-19) Notices which each last up to 3 months. Currently the (No 2) Renewal Notice fixes the end date as 23 December 2020. 30 working days after the end date is 1 March 2021.

- [4] The Police report has been received. The Police have now withdrawn their opposition. No report from the Medical Officer has been received as yet. The Inspector's report will be filed last, and so has not been received yet either.
- [5] The Committee is not able to decide the application until it has received the Medical Officer's report.
- [6] The Committee is concerned that justice delayed is justice denied and is anxious to progress the disposition of the application in the exigencies.
- [7] The Committee is unable to schedule a public hearing in 2020 because:
 - (i) it has not received the reports from the Medical Officer, and the Inspector; and also
 - (ii) due to other commitments of members, it is not possible to allocate a hearing date and give the notice required by s.202(4) of the Act before Christmas 2020.
- [8] Accordingly, the Committee requires the Medical Officer of Health to either file a report on the application within seven (7) days of this Minute, or, if that is not possible, to file an explanation with the Secretary of the Committee of why that is not possible and when the report might be expected to be filed as the Committee does not understand there to be any active COVID-19 cases in Canterbury at present. The report or the explanation can be filed by email. If the Medical Officer is not in a position to file a report and is not willing to provide any explanation within that seven (7) day period, the Committee would expect, as a matter of courtesy, to be advised by the Medical Officer that he/she relies on the legislative modification to s.103 to explain the delay.
- [9] The Committee requires the Inspector to complete his inquiries and draft his statutory report covering all matters relevant to the application except that part of his report concerning the Medical Officer's position/report, to the intent that the Inspector will be in a position to complete and file his report immediately upon receiving the Medical Officer's report.
- [10] The Committee will set the application down for a public hearing as soon as it receives the two outstanding agency reports.

MINUTE 2 OF COMMITTEE

- [1] The Committee has received an application for a new off-licence from Te Tino Enterprises Ltd. The application was received by the secretariat on the 2 July 2020.
- [2] This minute follows minute 1 of the Committee dated 19 November 2020.
- [3] The DLC received a report from the Medical Officer of Health on 8 December 2020, prior to the statutory close down period over Christmas/ New Year period starting on 20 December 2020 and ending 15 January 2021.
- [4] In the intervening time period since minute 1 was issued the former DLC secretary has left their term of employment with the Waimakariri District Council and a new secretary has been temporarily appointed effective from 24 December 2020.
- [5] The Committee note that in October 2020 the Waimakariri District Council resolved the following meeting dates for DLC meetings during 2021:

- [6] Given the number of submitters that have indicated that they wish to be heard, the Committee consider that it will be prudent to allow for two consecutive hearing days and a reserve day.
- [7] The Committee also acknowledge that with the recent change to the DLC secretary position, the statutory close down period and the timing of the Medical Officer of Health

report, that a hearing on or around the 26th of February is not likely feasible. Similarly, and as signalled in the first minute, the Committee are cognisant of the time elapsed by the application to date, and the need to progress the application without undue delay.

[7] Accordingly, the Committee now direct:

- [a] That the DLC Secretary is to arrange a public hearing across two consecutive days and a reserve day as soon as practicable. Public notice of this date is to be made in accordance with the requirements of the Act.
- [b] That the DLC Inspector is to complete his inquiries and the required statutory report as soon as practicable, in consultation with the timing for a public hearing set by the DLC secretary.



MINUTE 3 OF COMMITTEE

- [1] The Committee has received an application for a new off-licence from Te Tino Enterprises Ltd. The application was received by the Secretariat on the 2nd July 2020. It was publicly notified. The application attracted eighteen public objections.
- [2] A review of the application file has highlighted that two of the submissions received in objection to the proposal were received after the close of submissions. The respective dates for these objections in relation to the close of submissions are as follows:
 - Submission period closed: 5 August 2020 (Wednesday)
 Submission from H Singh received 7 August 2020 (Friday)
 Submission from D Sanders received 8 August 2020. (Saturday)
- [3] The committee have considered whether any party would be prejudiced by the acceptance of these two late submissions, and in making this decision have noted that the submissions were lodged within two working days of the closure of the submission period, during which time no specific reporting on the application was undertaken. In addition, the panel have noted that the objections do not introduce new matters that were not already captured in existing objections.
- [4] Accordingly, the Committee's decision is to waive the timeframe for the receipt of late objections from H Singh and D Sanders until 8 August 2020.
- [5] The panel has also received a request from the CDHB Alcohol licensing officer to consider revising the date for submitting disclosure evidence from the current due date of 8 March 2021 to a new due date of 12 March 2021, for the purpose of allowing additional time to provide adequate submissions. The chair has considered and confirmed this request.

[6] Accordingly, the panel now direct that any party wishing to present evidence should disclose this evidence to all parties via the secretary by 5.00pm on 12 March 2021.

 the newspaper. A Declaration must be submitted to the Licensing Committee to prove your compliance with
 this requirement.

[1] Te Tino Enterprises Limited has applied for a new OFF licence pursuant to Section 100 of the Act to operate a new retail bottle store known as Woodend Liquor Centre situated at Unit 2 - 61 Main North Road Woodend as shown in the site plan attached marked as **Appendix 1.**

Introduction

[2] The extisting business was first registerd to operate as Big Bites Pizza by Unnat Hospitality Limited. Unnat Hospitality was incorporated under the Companies Act 1993 on 24 August 2017. Narinder Singh is the director and shareholder of the company according to companies office records.

[3] The notice of registration under the Food Act 2014 for the Big Bites Pizza was issued by the Council on 13 May 2019 which expired on 13 May 2020.

A new registration was issued on 23 June 2020 which expires on 23 June 2021. Narinder Singh has confirmed that the business has ceased operating from mid December 2020.

ASSESSMENT OF CRITERIA FOR ISSUE OF LICENCE SECTION 105 AND 106 SSA ACT 2012

Suitability of the Applicant section 105 (1) (b)

- [4] Te Tino Enterprises Limited was incorporated under the Companies Act 1993 on 22 June 2020. Narinder Singh and Gurpreet Singh Dhillon are the directors and shareholders of the company according to companies office records.
- [5] I met with Narinder Singh and Gurpreet Singh Dhillon, the directors on 1 September 2020 at the Council office and discussed the application for the new OFF licence for the new bottle store and the requirements for the management of licensed premises. Heidi Schaffer the Administration Assistant and Licensing Inspector from ESU attended the meeting with me.
- [6] Narinder Singh stated that the premises is currently being operated as a Pizza Store and seeks the approval for a new OFF licence because the current business was not financially viable. He owns other food businesses, operates a taxi and is self-employed.
- [7] Gurpreet Singh Dhillon has been working at the Opawa Liquor Centre since May 2014 as the duty manger and holds a manager's certificate.
- [8] The applicant has provided a host responsibility policy that suitable measures will be undertaken with regard to the responsible sale and supply of alcohol .The company will employ two certified managers and support staff to operate their business.
- [9] The applicant did not display the knowledge of the demographic of Woodend. I do not believe the directors have the knowledge of the area, the current number of licensed premises and, sensitive sites within the close proximity of the proposed premises.
- [10] The applicant has failed to consult with the community and residents of Woodend. The Company did not provide a business plan or the trading name for the business. They were not aware of the residential areas at the back of their premises and the surrounding areas.
- [11] Narinder Singh is of the opinion that there is a need for another bottle store based on the population of Woodend and Ravenswood despite having an existing premises with OFF licence at 51 Main North Road which is a couple of blocks away from the proposed location.
- [12] The two directors were advised of the opposition from the residents, NZ Police MOH and the Woodend Sefton Community Board, copies of which have been given to them. They were informed that due to the opposition the application would be determined by the DLC at a public hearing.

Licensing hours - section 105 (d)

The applicant is seeking approval for the following licensed hours which complies with the current Local Alcohol Policy.

Monday to Sunday: 10.00 am to 10.00 pm.

Systems, staff and training

[13] The application lists the following duty managers:

Gurpreet Singh - certificate number 60/CERT/619/2015 expires on 29/07/2022 Ramandeep Singh - certificate number 60/CERT/615/2019 expired on 8 October 2020.

The design and layout of the premises section 105(1) (e)

[14] The proposed layout of the premises as detailed in the application lacked detail to consider whether the design and layout is suitable. The applicant has provided an updated plan as requested. The applicant proposes to install six more security cameras inside and outside the premises.

Sale of goods or services other than alcohol and food

[15] The applicant intends to sell tobacco and pre-packaged snacks as well as alcohol, low alcohol and non-alcoholic drinks.

Amenity and good order - section 105 (1) (h)

[16] Section 105 (1) (h) and (i) requires first the consideration of whether the amenity and good order of the locality in which the applicant's premises is situated would be negatively affected by more than a minor amount by noise, vandalism and nuisance from that premises, should the licence be issued and the business then allowed to operate and sell alcohol.

[17] Secondly there is consideration of whether any noise, vandalism and nuisance from existing licensed premises had eroded the amenity and good order to an extent where the issue of a further licence would have little effect, but it was never the less desirable not to issue any further licences in the area.

In Venus NZ Limited CIV2014-419-420 [2015] NZHC 1377 Heath J said:

"First, s 105(1) (h) and (i) of the 2012 Act, both of which deal with "amenity and good order" considerations, requires the Authority to form an "opinion". The need for a judicial body to form an independent opinion is conceptually different from a decision that is based on whether or not an application has established on a balance of probabilities that a relevant fact has been proved".

[18] For the reasons stated below under Section 106, I have formed the opinion that the amenity and good order of the locality would likely to be reduced, to more than a minor extent by the effects of the issue of the licence. Section 106 further provides for considering effects of issue of a licence on amenity and good order of the locality.

Section 106(1) (a) (iii) the number of premises for which licences of the kind concerned are already held;

[19] Currently operating within the building complex there is a licensed restaurant and the Pizza Store. There is one premises with Off licence about 100 metres away in a building complex which has a Tavern, bakery, Café, hair salon and other businesses adjoining the Woodend Community Centre.

[20] The Woodend Bowling Club is located next to the Woodend School and 79 Impresso Café is situated at 79 Main North Road .There are three premises with ON licence and one with OFF licence located within a kilometre of the proposed premises.

Section 106(1) (b) (i) the purpose of which land near the premises concerned is used:

[21] Sensitive sites within the vicinity include churches, schools, day care facilities, recreation park, community facilities, and residential areas. The applicant has not mentioned any sensitive sites in his application and to my knowledge is not aware of their location.

Section 106(1) (b) (ii) the purpose for which those premises will be used if the licence is issued:

- [22] I do not believe the proposed site is suitable considering the surrounding land use in close proximity with sensitive sites.
- [23] When considering the application, I have taken into account the amenity including noise and the amenity effects associated with increased levels of activity, anti- social behaviour and vehicle movements.
- [24] It is my opinion that the approval of the application is likely to have adverse effects to the amenity and good order values of this location due to increase activity from the new bottle store.
- [25] The following information is to assist the Committee in relation to the location of licensed premises and sensitive sites mentioned in my report as shown in the plan attached marked as **Appendix 2**.

Licensed Premises with OFF Licences

A. BOTTLE STORE

1. Canterbury Liquor Centre 51 Main North Road

Licensed Premises with ON licence

- 1 Little Haveli Indian restaurant 61 Main North Road

Reports by Police or Medical Officer of Health - Section 103

[26] The New Zealand Police had initially opposed the application as confirmed by their report dated 27 July 2020. The Police opposition has been now withdrawn as confirmed by their report dated 4 November 2020.

The Medical Officer of Health has opposed the application as confirmed by their report dated 8 December 2020. The grounds of opposition is stated in their report

Public Notification

[27] The appropriate public notice with regard to this application for the licence was made. Public notices were placed in The Northern Outlook on 15 and 22 July 2020.

A site notice was display at the premises from 15 July to 7 August 2020. The objection period closed on 5 August 2020.

- [28] Public notification of the application attracted eighteen letters of oppositions from local residents and Woodend Sefton Community Board.
- [29] The objectors have raised concerns in relation to the object of the Act, Local Alcohol Policy, the location, amenity and good order, harm to the community, suitability of the applicant and appropriate trained staff.
- [30] In my view the objections meet the test for the grounds for objections as set out in section 102 and 105 of the Act, which is quoted below.

Objections to applications -Section 102

- [31] (1) A person may object to the grant of a licence only if he or she has a greater interest in the application for it than the public generally.
- (2) An objection must be in writing and filed with the licensing committee within 15 working days after the first publication of the public notice of the making of the application.
- (3) No objection may be made in relation to a matter other than a matter specified in section 105.
- (4) An objection may be made only in relation to the suitability of the applicant if—
- (a) the application relates to any premises for which a licence is in force; and
- (b) the applicant seeks conditions the same as applying to that licence.
- (5) The secretary of the licensing committee concerned must give a copy of every objection to the applicant.

Resource Management and Building Certificate

[32] A Certificate pursuant to section 100(f) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 has been issued on 7 July 2020, which states that the premises meets the requirements of the Resource Management Act 1991and Building Act 2004.

Fire Safety

[33] The applicant has signed a statement that the building in which the premises are situated has an approved evacuation scheme for the public's safety that meets the requirements of section 76 of the Fire and Emergency Services New Zealand Act 2012.

The Fire and Emergency New Zealand have no objetion to the application being granted as confirmed by their email date 2 March 2021.

The District Plan and Building Act

[34] The District Plan was made operative on 1 November 2005. The Plan identifies the site as being located within the Business 1 Zone. The characteristics of the Business 1 Zone includes where people can enjoy extended visits to gather, socialise and do business.

[35] In terms of compliance with the Resource Management Act 1991, an activity such as a bottle store also falls in to a permitted activity under the Waimakariri District Plan, given the site is located within Business 1 Zone and therefore resource consent is not required.

A Building consent number BC180661 was issued on 24 July 2018 for the two-story building. Code of compliance certificate was issued on 24 July 2019.

[36] In my opinion, the site, building and activity subject to the issue of an OFF licence as described in the application by Te Tino Enterprises Limited, meets the requirements of the Resource Management Act 1991 and the Building Act 2004.

Local Alcohol Policy section 105(c)

[37] The Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 enables the Council to develop a Local Alcohol Policy (LAP) to further control the location of licensed premises, the number of licensed premises in the District or any part of the District, the maximum trading hours, impose discretionary conditions on the issue of licenses and impose one-way door restrictions.

The District Licensing Committee (DLC) and Alcohol Regulatory and Licensing Authority (ARLA) are required to consider the LAP when making licensing decisions.

[38] This Local Alcohol Policy contributes towards control of the adverse effects created by the misuse of alcohol. It reflects the local community's wishes regarding the sale and supply of alcohol providing local solutions to local problems.

[39] This policy has the objective of being consistent with the Community Development Strategy and the Community Action Plan on Alcohol prepared for the District as well as the objectives of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, which is provided for in Section 4 of the Act as:

- the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol should be undertaken safely and responsibly;
 and
- the harm caused by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol should be minimised

[40] This policy was adopted by Council on 3 February 2015 and came into force on 16 February 2015. This was reviewed in 2018 and adopted by the Council in December 2018 and comes into force in March 2019. The proposed retail bottle store is located within Business 1 Zone, in Woodend.

Conclusion

- [41] In deciding whether to issue a licence, the Licensing Authority or the Licensing Committee concerned must have regard to section 105 of the Act and any matters dealt with in any report from the Police, an Inspector, or a Medical Officer of Health made under <u>section 103</u>
- [42] The most relevant criteria are the matters set out in paragraphs (a) to (k) of section 105(1), any matters dealt with in any report from the Police, an inspector, or a Medical Officer of Health made by virtue of section 103 and the manner in which the applicant has sold or, as the case may be, sold and supplied, displayed, advertised, or promoted alcohol.
- [43] In considering an application the licensing inspector is required to inquire and report on the application pursuant to section 103 and the criteria for the new licence as required by section 105 of the Act.
- [44] I have assessed the application in light of the purpose, object and criteria of the Act and I believe the granting of the licence will increase alcohol harm to the community. I am not satisfied that the application meets the criteria set out in section 105.
- [45] The relevant statutory provisions in sections 105(1) (h) and 106 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 provide that the Alcohol Regulatory and Licensing Authority (ARLA) or Licensing Committee are required to form an opinion as to whether the amenity and good order of a locality would be likely to be reduced to a more than minor extent by the effects of the issue of the licence.
- [46] It is my opinion that the approval of the application is likely to have adverse effects to the amenity and good order values of this location despite being in the business area of Woodend.
- [47] That it is my view that approval of the application would not be consistent with the object and purpose of the Act. In reaching this conclusion, I have particular regard to the increase in the number of bottle stores will not reduce alcohol harm in the community.
- [48] Based on the information available, I oppose the application and support the opposition by the Medical Officer of Health. My grounds of opposition are as follows;
 - (a) The applicant has failed to take necessary steps to consult the Community.
 - (b) The applicant has no local knowledge of sensitive sites and other licensed premises.
 - (c) I find that the directors have no experience in managing a licensed premises and failed to demonstrate suitability.
 - (d) I believe the granting of the licence will increase alcohol harm to the community. I am not satisfied that the application meets the criteria set out in section 105.

I have referred to the following decisions regarding suitability to assist the Committee.

Pangotra Holdings (Palmerston North) Limited v Sargent [2016] NZARLA 73, supported the view that knowledge of the locality and lack of consultation is an important part of the evaluations of the applicant's suitability, para [24].

In all where there is an application for a licence or Manager's certificate the onus is clearly on the applicant to prove their suitability. The Authority referred to three well established cases in Crave [2013] NZARLA 456,

As **Dobson J stated in Casino Bar (No 3) Limited** the approach to suitability must be in context specific. **Page v Police 24/7/98, Pankhurst J, HC, Christchurch AP84/98** reiterated that the onus is on the applicant to establish its suitability which is not determined in a vacuum. The ultimate test is that mentioned in **Re Sheard (supra)** as to whether the evidence establishes that the applicant will properly carry out its statutory responsibilities.

The preferred approach to the issue of suitability is contained in the comments of **Panckhurst J in Page v Police** (unreported HC V Christchurch AP 84/98 24 July 1998). He stated:

"Section 13(1) (a) provides that the applicant for an on-licence must demonstrate his or her suitability. In other words, what is required is a positive finding. That implies an onus upon the applicant to demonstrate suitability. Such suitability is not established in a vacuum but in the context of the particular case: for example, the place, the intended business (here in a difficult central city location), the nature of the business itself, the hours of operation and the intended activities, provide the basis for the assessment of the individual."

Summary

[49] Discussing the object of the Act 1989 Act, the Court of Appeal said in Meads Brothers Ltd v Rotorua District Licensing Agency [2002] NZAR 308 (CA) at [23] and [24] respectively:

"The stated objective of envisages that the licensing system should be responsible. This indicates the intention that controls that are imposed under it should be neither excessive nor oppressive. The object also reflects a legislative perception that controls provided by the licencing system have the capacity to contribute to the reduction of alcohol abuse in the community but that there are limits to this limited capacity.

[50] In Police v Absolute Caterers Ltd [2013] NZARLA 946.

The Authority confirmed at [12] that the Court of Appeal's comments in Meads Brothers Ltd as "to a reasonable licensing system, the controls of which should not be oppressive or excessive, remain good law under the regime introduced by the 2012 Act".

[51] In Hari Om (2013) Limited NZARLA [2014], the Authority stated at [27].

Whether or not this application should be granted resolves around a consideration of section 105(1) (h) and 105(1) (a) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2021. The issue is whether the amenity and good order values of the locality would be likely to be reduced, to more than a minor extent, by the effects of the issue of the licence is one of the new criteria introduced by the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.

Section 106(1) (a) (iii) requires the Authority to have regard to the number of premises for which similar OFF licences are already held. Thus, whilst under the Sale of Alcohol Act 1989 the proliferation of liquor licences was not relevant, it now becomes more relevant.

[52] The Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act signals a new community oriented approach incorporating both the purpose and object provisions. A key purpose of the Act is to put in place, for the benefit of the community as a whole a new system of control over the sale and supply of alcohol. The object is now to minimisation of harm is not merely reduction. This means reduce to the smallest amount of degree. The applicant has failed to meet the legislative requirements.


Recommendation



TE TINO ENTERPRISES LTD | APPLICATION FOR ISSUE OF OFF LICENCE

- 1. As you are aware, we act for Te Tino Enterprises Limited (*Te Tino*).
- 2. We refer to the Police's letter dated 27 July 2020 and our subsequent discussion in relation to the above matter.
- 3. The Police have objected to Te Tino's application for an off-licence in relation to the proposed premises at Unit 2, 61 Main North Road, Woodend. The grounds of objection are that:
 - a. The plan initially submitted by Te Tino "is not detailed to show the layout of the store therefore the agencies cannot assess this."
 - b. Te Tino's application contained insufficient information "as to whether or not the premises will be a franchise and how it will operate in regards to signage."
- 4. The Police has said it would consider revising its objection to the application if information addressing these matters were provided.
- 5. In relation to 3.a.:
 - a. **Enclosed** is a detailed floorplan setting out the proposed location of different alcohol products within the premises.
 - b. We note that RTD product stands are not located near the entrance to the premises or the sales counter, this being the Police's primary concern in relation to product location. Rather, RTD products are located in the chiller area.
 - c. Non-alcoholic drinks will be located next to the main entrance for the premises.
 - d. The layout for alcohol products reflected in the floorplan represents a standard layout for off-licence premises. Similar layouts are used by various other license holders in Canterbury.

- 6. On relation to 3.b.:
 - a. Te Tino will carry on business as a franchisee of the Liquor Centre franchise.
 - b. We **enclose** a document showing the proposed external signage for the premises.
 - c. Te Tino confirms that it is not proposing external advertisement of liquor products specials or otherwise. A Liquor Centre flag would be placed outside the premises, but this would not contain advertisement of alcoholic products.
 - d. Te Tino confirms the external signage would not obstruct the view into the store premises from the outside, as demonstrated in the document **enclosed**.
- 7. We trust that the above satisfies the Police's request for further information and that the objection may now be withdrawn.
- 8. Should you require any additional, however, please do not hesitate to get in touch.

I refer to your request received by our office on 13th July 2020 together with the application for an offlicence by the above applicant for the proposed premises situated at 61 Main North Road, Woodend.

The Medical Officer of Health (MOH) has inquired into this application and wishes to raise matters in opposition to it in accordance with the statutory requirement under s103(3)(b).

Criteria:

The MOH considers that the following criteria under s105 are engaged in the application:-

Section 105(1)(e)- the design and layout of any proposed premises

The design and layout of the store indicates a large portion of the shop area will be a chiller room as well as a separate RTD's (ready to drink) fridge situated immediately inside the entrance. I have also learned that since lodging the application, the applicant has joined the Liquor Centre franchise, however, no further information has been provided about how the store will be signposted, marketed, or promoted from the street and in the neighbourhood.

Section 105(1)(h) - whether (in its opinion) the amenity and good order of the locality would be likely to be reduced, to more than a minor extent, by the effects of the issue of the licence

According to the 2018 NZ census, Woodend has a population of 2784 and in a reply to why the applicant thinks Woodend needs another bottle store, the applicant replied:

The population of Woodend at the 2018 census was 2,784 (Statistic NZ). The generally accepted standard is one off licence per 1000 residents. This location easily falls within that range as there is only one other off licence in the town.

The applicant also provided the following information sourced directly from the Enterprise Canterbury website:

- Woodend (including the Ravenswood estate) and Pegasus are two growing towns
 within walking distance of each other. Also, a new subdivision "Two Roads" is under
 constructions which is all sold out according to Yoursection.nz website Nearby are
 the two villages of Tuahiwi and Waikuku and the beach communities of Woodend
 Beach and Waikuku Beach.
- Currently home to a combined total of 8840 residents; The population has seen rapid growth (23% increase in 5 years) and will continue to do so.
- Pegasus is expected to house a population of 6000 when complete, Ravenswood is expected to house 4000 and the remainder of the Woodend area is expected to grow to 6,900. This makes a total projected population of 16,900* by 2043.
- State Highway 1 runs between Ravenswood and Pegasus and carries 17,400 vehicles per day. This is expected to grow to 28,000 vehicles per day by 2027.

From this, it appears that the applicant is considering targeting a wider catchment.

The applicant currently uses the proposed premises to provide a pizza takeaway service but failed to demonstrate detailed knowledge of the community in his initial application.

Section 105(1)(k) – the further matters dealt with in this report from the MOH

For the following reasons:

The application is for a new off-licence in Woodend in circumstances where the area;

- already accommodates numerous sensitive sites or services for the community within close proximity to the applicant's proposed premises which is located at the heart of the township.
- has high volumes of passing traffic which appears to be the target market for the applicant
 who believes that "it is an appropriate site for local customers and passing tourists to be able
 to easily access this site from the main road."
- already has issues relating to parking congestion and road safety. The nature of this business
 has the potential to increase this risk not just for users of the main road but also for customers
 of the other businesses in the block.

The Medical Officer of Health submits that adding an additional stand-alone bottle store would likely increase alcohol related harm in Woodend and its environs and the effects of excessive and inappropriate consumption of alcohol may present themselves in the community in many ways.
