# **Submission:**

The CDHB supports clause 1 which provides for more intensive development of hospital sites as this is generally more efficient than expanding onto other sites. The CDHB supports the reference in clause 2 to taking into account functional and operational need and hospital site safety, security and accessibility. Working hospitals have many specific requirements, including: patient, visitor and plant security; 24 hour operations; the need to run electricity generators in emergencies; fast and efficient access; and the ability to respond to evolving health needs. It is therefore important that these aspects are recognized in the relevant policies.
