5. MATTERS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MINUTES

- Simoné met with Niki on Transport Project

6. REPORTS FOR DISCUSSION - COUNCILLORS

a) Niki Mealings

- Big council meeting today which is held once a month covering a large amount, about 570 pages of information
- Last week adopted the Annual Plan
- Report received on the weather storm event. Drainage staff had been around and
 pre-emptively cleared drains and deployed sucker trucks to ensure all drainage
 was a good as it could be prior to the large rains. 150 Service requests were
 received and will keep the council team busy.
- Zack mentioned that he worked with Lauren to share the Emergency Operation Centre messaging for the rain event to get this to youth
- Dean from Civil Defence & possible training for the Youth Council members
- The Greater Christchurch Transport partnership: discussed the draft Canterbury regional passenger transport plan.
- Also discussed the MRT, which I think that's really a moving feast, it'll be interesting because CCP has analysed things ad nauseam and are awaiting an

- outcome. Ensure you give you feedback whenever you have the opportunity to do so. Discussion about Rail and that it is not ideal at the moment and needs research for consideration.
- Community Wellbeing North Canterbury Trust, the largest provider of mental health services in North Canterbury & Niki is a trustee. 2 major things: they run Karanaga Mai Parents' College, and Kaiapoi Food bank. The largest in North Canterbury, with unprecedented demand for food parcel. June, food drive with support from Ray White. Niki will email information to group to circulate.
- Youth Week was cool, and music event was great. Will ensure schedule around Rock Quest next time due to clash.
- Planting at Kaiapoi lagoon off Lees Road with student volunteer army
- Went spotlighting for mudfish.

b) Simoné

- Public Transport Project:
 - A project to look at how public transport could be improved. Acknowledged that it wouldn't have as much impact as hoped, which is OK, as contribution and even if a change in a small way that is good.
 - Working with ECan on some of the programs and promoting these and they are looking to change a couple of routes & adding others.
 - WYC previously proposed to greater Christchurch partnership years ago.
 - Simoné promoted the wider lens and wider needs of North Canterbury as growing significantly & over years to come.
 - Improving or increasing the bus routes and public system and public transport systems in northern Canterbury might be a really good idea to look at. While we're still like on a smallish scale. Working towards that.
 - Hopefully a meeting next week to go over suggestions.
- Suggestion for a Year 12 Scholarship & Applications Project:
 - To review Scholarships and applications as everything starts happening soon including university applications. Project aim in promoting the different scholarships or methods for getting scholarships. Especially at Ara that there are a lot if unused scholarships.
 - Clarification on Students loads, StudyLink and halls of residence applications etc.
 Possible run with a "Op Shop Hop" event promoting scholarship information.
