# 5. Dudley Park

- Funding approved from Sport Canterbury Tū Manawa Active Aotearoa
- **6.** Rātā Foundation application [question asked: given that it is has been six months, should we look at another funding application?] Answer: expectation is that we will have a response in the next few weeks.

# 7. Environment Group

- River clean-up held on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> September (Ashley Rakahuri River Clean Up)
  - Initially thought there would not be much rubbish to collect. However, nearly a full skip of rubbish was collected over a two-hour period of cleanup.
  - 55 people turned up from all generations
  - Depressing seeing the rubbish but uplifting to see so many people turn up to the Ashley Rakahuri River Clean Up event.

#### 8. WaiYouth

- Decided to not do Centre Stage as not sufficient interest expressed in the event with only eight people willing to audition. Instead, WaiYouth will look to hold a Halloween Movie night:

  - The program looks at pairing a younger person (aiming at High School age and MTFJ) with a Council Staff member, who shadow the staff member for the day.
  - o 30 positions at Council have already volunteered to participate
  - Date for the 'A day in the life' program not set as yet but will likely be second half of 2026.
