Waimakarri District Plan Submission Regarding RLZ R16. Extended use of Rangiora A & P Sjhowgrounds.

#### INTRODUCTION.

My wife Joyce and I reside on the corner of Coldstream Road and Bridget Lane which is of course adjacent to the A&P showgrouinds. Consequently we are aware of whats happening in the showgrounds.

As a general rule we have no problem wiith event held at the showgrounds with the exception of course the Muscle Car Festval held for four days annually. Any suggestion that there could be other motor vehicle events even slightly similar to the muscle car festival is a cause of great concern.

The fact that the muscle car festival is held and is the example that we judge things by obviously influences our thinking and opposition to further similar events.

#### **ENFORCEMENT**

If the District Council was to take action to impliment and effectively enforce rules to manage the muscle car festival that could also apply to other motor vehicle events then we probably would not have much of a problem.

In my view current defects with the management of the muscle car festival are as follows:

- \*Freedom camping of caravans and motor homes on the verge of Coldstream Road on the day prior to the opening of the festival
- \*Noise Control. This is particularly important. A common occurrence is the mindless incessant reving of engines late into the night sometimes up till midnight annd again early in the morning. In my view this practice should be modified byn the imposition of engine reving hours eg 8am to 8pm and the prohibition of mindless continuous engine reving.
- \*General noise beyond a reasonable hour caused by loud music can extend well into the early morning..
- \*The caravan/ motor home parking location which is behind the hedge on Coldstream Road. A considerable amount of noise eminates from this area late at night so it would be sensible to move that camping area way to the north east side of the grounds to avoid the nuisance to residents.

#### GENERAL

Compliance with speed limit on Coldstream Road.

Coldstream Road is obviously a continuation of the 50kph area from Ashley Street and is such until it reaches the Events Centre where there is very good speed limit signage recently installed.

Unfortunately it is a pretty common practice for drivers turning into Coldstrteam Road from Ashley Street to immediately accelarate as if they were entering a 50 or 100 kph area. In my view considiering the recent addition of the Events Centre the muscle car festival and any proposed events as a result of any rule changes it would be sensible to erect 50kph signage at the Ashley Street/ coldstream road intersection to remind driversof the speed limit. We are aware of course that an extra sign is not strictly required but we believe that an extra sign would be of great benefit to the residents..

#### CONCLUSION

The area surrounding the A&P showgrounds is occupied by a fairly large number of elderly residents who rely on the ability to have peace and quiet and have a good nights sleep. It is not unreasonable for them to expect that their \ elected representatives should look after their interests.
