This new proposal is in conflict with Pegasus Town Covenants. The covenants override the proposal. Why has it been allowed? The covenants are supposed to protect us from this very thing. We built in Pegasus with confidence (as other residents did) that we were protected by the covenants. If the developers do not enforce them (Templeton Group) it falls to the private individual to do so which is expensive, time consuming and stressful. New developers and existing landowners could end up in legal battles. Some newly built houses may have to be pulled down with this situation that is being created. Going to arbitration can be a very lengthy, costly and drawn out process. Covenants are legally binding. Courts in NZ have an obligation to enforce if bought before them. You will be forcing your residents into costly time consuming legal battles. All could be avoided if the council objects to the governments ruling on these grounds. Statistics NZ describe Pegasus as a small urban area. The population at the 2018 census was 2,637. Even now the population of Pegasus is only 4500. Covenant 3.1- No more than 1 dwelling house can be constructed on any lot. Covenant 3.46 -No lot maybe subdivided.
