## **NZPCA South Island Coaches Conference Report**

**Date:** 24th–25th May 2025

**Location:** South Island

**Theme:** Fit, Feel and Fun

### **Overview**

The 2025 NZPCA South Island Coaches Conference brought together coaches from across the region for a weekend focused on improving coaching practices through the lens of Fit, Feel, and Fun. The conference was packed with updates, workshops, and hands-on learning opportunities aimed at enriching both coaches and their riders.

### **Saturday Highlights**

#### **Welcome & Education Updates**

The conference began with registrations, a warm welcome, and introductions. A key focus was placed on the latest updates in education and development:

- **C+ to A Syllabus Reflections:**
  - C+ Dressage: Emphasis on rider proficiency in movements.
  - B Lungeing: Not examined, but riders must demonstrate a foundational understanding of lunging techniques.

- **Badges:** A new downloadable worksheet will accompany badge achievements.

- **Riders Without Horses:** This initiative is being relaunched, with further details to be shared at the upcoming AGM.

- **Exams and Certifications:** Coaches or committee members present at rider exams must register candidates via Nominate for certificate issuance.

### **Training Programs**

- **ECTP (Equestrian Coaches Training Program)** and the **Pony Club Academy** are now fully accessible online via the NZPCA website. Coaches are encouraged to explore these platforms and reach out for support if needed.

- **Currently there is a discount code SICCC2025 for free shipping on the NZPCA website.**

### **Breakout Sessions & Presentations**

#### **Morning Session – Horse Balance and Collection:**

Jo Street (National Coach) delivered a practical session on the importance of bringing a horse's legs underneath to shift its balance off the forehand, forming the foundation for collection. Jo did a great example of this by being a human horse.

#### **Breakout Options:**

One standout session attended was **Lizzie Turnbull's "Growth Mindset"**, which explored:

- The value of a positive, resilient attitude.
- Recognition that success includes challenges.
- The impact of social media on perception versus reality.
- The importance of sportsmanship in team selection, beyond competitive results.

#### **Flatwork Progressions:**

A key workshop detailed flatwork expectations across levels:

- C+: Turn on the forehand.
- B: Sitting trot and leg yield.
- A: Counter canter.

Coaches were provided with tools to teach these movements effectively and emphasized that horses learn best through association.

#### **Product Presentation – DynaviteNZ:**

Jeremy Clake introduced Dynavite's range of equine products, outlining their benefits

and offering a discount code for attendees. Discount code is either NZPC or NZPC20 he couldn't remember.

#### **Afternoon Demonstration – Advanced Flatwork:**

Demo riders showcased:

- Work towards shoulder-in.
- Riding without stirrups – a critical exercise for rider development.
- The session highlighted how rider's bodies respond instinctively to "feel" even if incorrectly aligned.

#### **Coaching Anxious Riders:**

Louise Ilton and Nicola Ward (National Coaches) shared insights on identifying and coaching anxious

riders. Strategies included:

- Starting with horsemanship activities.
- Using music to create a relaxed environment.
- Emphasizing clear instruction and structured environments (e.g., cones).

#### **Day One Wrap-Up:**

The day concluded with the NZPCA Awards, nibbles, and refreshments, providing an excellent opportunity for coaches to network and reflect.

### **Sunday Highlights**

#### **Morning Q&A and Pathways Discussion**

The day began with a Q&A session reflecting on Saturday's learnings. Lizzie

Turnbull led a discussion on opportunities beyond the arena, including:

- International exchanges (e.g., China).
- Involvement in the Riders' Council.
- The Pony Club Academy as a platform for leadership development.
- Reminder about the new Constitution, all the updates and recording are saved on the NZPCA website and are located here: [New Zealand Pony Club - 2025 Constitution Update](#) every member needs to be aware of the up and coming changes.

### **Horse Management – Lower Leg Focus**

A detailed session explored common issues in the horse's lower leg and how to identify potential problems early.

### **Cross-Country Practical**

Out on the course, coaches worked on applying flatwork principles to cross-country riding, emphasizing:

- Balance
- Secure rider position
- Rhythm

### **Lungeing and Jumping Session**

A session tailored for **B-level lunging** provided:

- Basics of safe lunging.
- Benefits for both horse and rider.
- Creative approaches to jump training using only six poles—ideal for mixed-level groups.

### **Conclusion**

The conference concluded with a group discussion on key takeaways. Coaches left feeling inspired and better equipped to promote the principles of Fit, Feel, and Fun in their teaching. The weekend reinforced the value of ongoing education, peer collaboration, and the importance of supporting riders holistically, both in and out of the saddle.

It would be beneficial for the club in the future to have more members/coaches attend as we have found there are so many great sessions that we couldn't attend all of them.
